

The site of Williamsburg, Brooklyn is a multicultural community with a large population that initially migrated from Puerto Rico.





Concept Poetry: Sense of Place

People tend to look forward because the past is missing in our lives. I want to create a new stage for those forgotten traditions and cultures, and I imagine the design of the space can warm up our memories, just like tea and its parent culture — hot beverage. The idea behind the generalization of tea is parallel to the issue of our site: gentrification. Both the neighborhood of Fort Greene and the tea subculture are facing the same problem, and the problem is that people are forgetting about history due to changes in the original nature of things. The invention of teabag made it possible for more people to buy and try different kinds of tea and making tea one of the most popular drinks besides coffee. However, every coin has two sides: the invention of the teabag also led to the generalization of tea. In other words, the increased accessibility of tea led to its decline in terms of ritual. Nowadays, the excessive use of teabag shortens the entire tea preparation process and distorts the original meaning or ideology of drinking tea.





The company is focused on both emotional and rational triggers in marketing. When both of these triggers appear, they are more likely to arouse the interests of audience.






For the interior space, I have an idea of creating a fabric drop ceiling that can transmit some of the ceiling light into the space.


The drop ceiling can act as a filter to produce a kind of diffused lighting effect, which not only makes the space appear more tranquil, but also provides a calm and soothing environment to the people inside the space.

Each drip of ceiling contains herbal tea leaves and flowers that acts as an aroma tea bag which can help people release stress and pressure.


### PHASE I























### PHASE II


Based on the concept models, I started to consider the exterior quality of the tower.


The NYC Department of Transportation Street Seats Program (NYC DOT) is a seasonal project that reclaims portions of New York City's streets for much needed public space. Since 2016, Parsons School of Design has collaborated with the NYC DOT to design and build a public park through an undergraduate elective class offered by the BFA in Architectural Design. Over the course of the spring semester, the project is designed and constructed by students from Parsons School of Constructed Environments in collaboration with students from other colleges at The New School. 


The space can be used as an escape from New York City's stressful environment. Forms inspired by an organic shape surrounded by whimsical plantings can create a relaxing atmosphere.

The plan and elevation are married by the design's materiality, geometry, and focus on the user experience.





East Facing Rendering




South Facing Rendering

### PLANTER CONSTRUCTION DRAWINGS







The seating, tables and vertical fence are made of Red Western Cedar. The cedar does not need to be painted or stained with any chemicals as it's naturally rot and insect-resistant. Our lighting is solar powered, the day's energy stored in batteries on site and then released at night through energy efficient LED strips.





The red canvas that clads the seats and tables had previously wrapped the New School's water tower. When the water tower was replaced in early 2019, the canvas was on its way to the landfill until a quick-acting faculty member saved it to be reused, without knowing what it could be used for. The team jumped at the opportunity to reuse the canvas by cladding the seat fronts and using the material's transparency to create a glowing nighttime lighting effect.
